# **Housing Centenary celebrations**

Spring was busy with centenary events; Community Orchard planting; Youth nights on Gannochy Green; and the Events Group's cream tea and Gannochy centenary exhibition.

Very grateful thanks are due to the volunteers of the Gannochy Events Group for their Centenary Cream Tea event on 31 May, attended by over 50 residents and for their amazing Gannochy exhibition in the Community Hall that was extended to Saturday 1st June. On display were photos of the building of Gannochy homes in 1924, the 1930 census providing names of Gannochy residents,

stories of life in Gannochy, items representing home life in the past 100 years, and two celebration banners made by Gannochy families. Over three Friday evening's in May, we also held the Centenary Gannochy Youth Nights and hosted youth games, live music, and bike repair workshops for over 40 young people each week.



The next centenary celebration event is our Gannochy Summer Challenges for Gannochy kids aged 12 and under. There are five weeks of fun Challenges for individuals or teams in packs that will be delivered weekly. Each weekly winner will receive a goodie bag and the opportunity to nominate a charity of their own choice to receive a £50 donation. 

### **Bob's Corner**

**Shower head cleaning** Shower heads can be a source of bacteria build up, particularly if they haven't been used for a while. To avoid a build up of black mould, regular running of the shower to avoid standing water is good practice. Removing and cleaning it thoroughly in antibacterial spray, and rinsing with hot soapy water regularly, helps prevent mould or bacteria.

# **Electrical Installation Condition Reports (EICR's):**

The Trust has a 5-year cyclical Electrical Inspection programme in place via Steve Brown Electricals who have been contracted to carry out this work. A representative from their company contacts each household 'when applicable' to arrange a suitable day when this work may be carried out. The new expansion houses at Camilla Bell Crescent and Gannochy Road have now been added to this programme.

#### **Festive lights**

The rolling programme of rhones maintenance is being disrupted by festive lights. Please ensure these are removed so that painting and cleaning can take place without delays, or damage to your lights.

**Gas leaks and carbon monoxide alarms** - In the event of a gas leak or suspected gas leak, or if your carbon monoxide detector activates with a continuous alarm, please contact the **National Grid Gas Emergencies on 0800 111 999** immediately and please take the following steps;

- Turn off Gas at meter (quarter turn the handle on pipe at the side of the meter.
- Turn off all gas appliances
- Don't use electrical appliances or light switches
- Open all doors and windows
- Don't smoke or use naked flames
- Don't turn supply back on until remedial action is taken and authorised by a competent person.
